1. Practice gap reminder

2. Alternate revenue

Ms. Dean informed the committee that Dr. Hekler has taken the lead on a sub-group which is working on identifying alternate sources of revenue and sponsorship. The group has identified three target markets; start-ups, established consumer health companies, and universities/government/related professional societies. The group is currently drafting a targeted pitch and prospectus for each group. Ms. Dean also requested that the committee provide any contacts/suggestions for potential sponsors/partnerships for the upcoming Annual Meeting and SBM.

3. Update on the featured poster session

Dr. Shelton provided a brief description of the history of the featured poster session, explaining that 2015 was the first year the featured poster session was introduced with the "null results" poster session which was held on Thursday midday. The featured poster session was continued in 2016 with the null results posters with the addition of SBIR posters. Due to post-meeting evaluation feedback requesting a longer lunch period for attendees, the featured poster session will now be held during an evening poster session (most likely the Friday evening poster session).

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The featured poster session will continue to feature null results and SBIR posters and a question will be added to abstract submission asking submitters to specify which type of presentation they are submitting.

4. Identified additional topic area chairs

Dr. Shelton explained that the topic areas were introduced during the 2017 Annual Meeting planning process and took the place of the tracks and content areas. The main purpose for the change was to streamline the abstract submission and review process, the 15 tracks varied considerably with some tracks receiving hundreds of abstract submissions and others receiving only a handful making it difficult for chairs to assign abstracts to expert reviewers.

Each topic area has one or two topic area chairs and the chair(s) invite abstract reviewers to review the abstracts submitted to that particular topic area, then assign abstracts and make recommendations based on the reviewer scores and comments. In the past, track chairs were asked to serve for three years, invitations were sent out each year giving chairs the option to opt out if they are no longer able to serve in the role. Since 2017 was the first year for the vast majority of topic area chairs the invitation will be extended to the same group. Not all of the topic areas will need two chairs (based on the number of abstract submissions per topic area from 2017). The names grayed out on the spreadsheet have completed the third year of their term and will not be asked to serve again for the 2018 Annual Meeting.

The committee submitted suggestions on the call as well as via email once the call had concluded.

5. Abstract submission timeline reminder

Dr. Shelton gave the committee a brief overview of the abstract submission timeline and informed them they would be receiving promotional posters to encourage colleagues to submit abstracts and attend the 2018 Annual Meeting.
