

\$103,456 total contributions made to support the next generation of behavioral medicine researchers, be heard by policy makers, communicate members' science to the public, and support postdoctoral member research.

- Over 140 registrants and \$10,000+ raised for SBM student members during the first Stride for Science Run/Walk
- 2 postdocs each awarded an \$8,000 Bridging the Gap Research Award
- \$35,000+ raised to cover the Monica Baskin Diversity Institute tuition for 150 young professionals from underrepresented backgrounds



## **Mentoring**

- 24 early-career professionals participated in the Diversity Institute to build their careers

### **Policy Advocacy**

- 6 position statements released, including "Protect Abortion Rights" and "Increase WIC's Cash Value Benefit for Fruit and Vegetable Purchases"
- 99 touchpoints with federal legislators, via 38 SBM policy ambassadors, including 11 new ambassadors focused on climate change and health
- 30 endorsements and sign-ons including a letter to the White House urging nomination of a new National Institutes of Health director who values behavioral science
- 9 Washington, DC, policy trainings attended by ambassadors
