#### 1. Minutes Approval 8/6 and 8/20

# 2. Abstract Update & Program Planning Meeting Reminder (October 26-30)

Dr. Steinberg to use information from the R13 grant to write up the practice gaps. Dr. Steinberg will also create 3 learning objectives based on inclusion, innovation, and influence.

### 5. Keynote & Master Lecture Speaker Follow Up

Dr. Steinberg gave an update on the plenary speakers. She reached out to Tori from Outspoken about two of the speakers on our list Julia Collins and Paula Stone Williams. Tori said both of them are open that week. As for pricing, they would still be around \$5,000 each. We have \$20,000 total budgeted for speakers. \$20,000 divided between 3 keynotes and 2 master lectures comes out to \$4,000 a person. If we feel we could offer some of the other speakers less than \$4,000, we could nook Julia and Paula at their \$5,000 rate. Alternatively, we could say we have this much to offer would they be willing to speak online for an hour. They are not traveling and we are a non-profit. Another idea is to offer keynotes more than master lectures since they are the largest draw.

Feranmi Okanlami, MD, MS (Keynote)

Title: Assistant Professor, University of Michigan

Topic: Disability doesn't mean inability: the importance of welcoming those to the table who had different experiences in order to improve health.

Other facts: Clinically trained in primary care and rehab medicine - he suffered a spinal cord injury, paralyzing him from the chest down. After two surgeries and intense rehabilitation, he regained some motor function.

Nadine Burke Harris, MD (Keynote)

Title: founder and CEO of the Center for Youth Wellness.

Topic: How childhood trauma affects health across a lifetime

Other facts: Pediatrician and also surgeon general of California. She has a lot of expertise in how ACEs and toxic stress impact health later in life. Wrote the book: The Deepest Well: Healing the

Long-Term Effects of Childhood Adversity Theme focus areas: Inclusion and Influence

Hanna Valentine, MD (Keynote)

Title: NIH Chief Officer for Scientific Workforce Diversity and Senior Researcher at NHBI Topic: Bias and Systemic Racism in Academic Health Care: NIH Strategies for Change.

Other facts: Previously a Professor of CVD Medicine at Stanford University

Theme focus areas: Inclusion, innovation, & influence

Topics: Inclusion and allyship and how to work in diverse teams; leadership, workplace

behaviors, inclusion (LGBTQ), gender identity

Other facts: pastor, counselor, speaker, LGBTQ ambassador, transgender woman, and gender

equity advocate.

Theme focus areas: Inclusion and Influence

#### Julia Collins

Title: Founder and CEO, Planet FWD; a company aiming to reform food systems and reduce climate change; Former co-founder of Zume Pizza - a technology-enabled food company to improve food access.

Topics: Improving population health through innovation and entrepreneurship

Other facts: First Black woman to achieve unicorn status (having a company valued at >\$1billion).

Her recent company is funded all by POC and women.

Theme focus areas: Innovation and also Influence and Inclusion
