MINUTES

The June 26 SPLC minutes were approved as written.

SBM WEBINAR SERIES

Dr. Schneider provided an introduction to the newly-developed SBM <u>webinar series</u> and invited council members to share the program with their liaison partners and to consider webinars as another possible product to co-develop. Dr. Goodrich noted that interest may already exist at ACSM for a webinar collaboration, and that he would get in touch with members of the SBM/ACSM planning committee. Dr. Janke inquired about offering free access to SPLC partner organizations, particularly for co-developed webinars; Dr. Schneider will follow up with the webinar planning committee to determine if this would be possible.

LIAISON REPORTS

ACSM/VA

Dr. Goodrich reported that the SBM/ACSM panel discussion on implementation science has been accepted for the 2018 ACSM meeting. Dr. Goodrich also reported that Team Red, White & Blue will be

participating in a panel discussion at the 2018 Annual Meeting, and that their local chapter representative would be in attendance.

Society for Medical Decision Making

Dr. Waters reported that a symposium developed by the SBM/SMDM cross-talk committee has been planned for the SMDM Annual Meeting in October. The committee is also discussing adapting the session for the 2018 SBM Annual Meeting, and Dr. Waters noted that she would suggest adapting the session into a webinar in addition to or instead of a conference session.

The Obesity Society and Obesity Week 2017

Dr. Davis reported that the symposium submitted for Obesity Week 2017 had been accepted, and she is working to confirm speakers for the session. Dr. Davis added that while there weren't any sessions being planned with TOS for the 2018 Annual Meeting, she has been increasingly working with the American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery (ASMBS) in planning for Obesity Week, and that it may be worthwhile to explore a collaborative relationship with that organization moving forward.

American College of Lifestyle Medicine

Dr. Janke reported that Dr. Gary Bennett will be presenting a standalone session at the Lifestyle Medicine 2017 conference in October, in lieu of participation in a strategic partner showcase. Dr. Winter added that she would be following up with an invitation to ACLM to submit "best-of" abstracts.
