The Friedman School seeks a faculty member with expertise in community, health system, or novel technology strategies for behavioral health change and a strong desire to innovate, train future leaders, and achieve large-scale impact. The candidate will join the Friedman School during an ongoing effort to expand its emphasis on relationships among individual, community, and policy interventions and behavior change. The Friedman School is actively growing and recruiting faculty in many multidisciplinary areas, including the present position; global burdens of nutrition-related chronic diseases; food systems, sustainability, and climate change; policy implementation and evaluation; food industry and food systems analysis; and computational methods and models for 'big data' in nutrition.

The Friedman School seeks a behavioral scientist whose goal is to improve nutrition and public health through research and practice with a major and explicit focus on understanding community, health system or novel technology strategies and related behavioral and social processes. Applicants should have demonstrated expertise in conceptualizing and conducting innovative, interdisciplinary, and multi-method research on health-related behavior across the life span. Preference will be given to candidates with strong methodological expertise and a clear approach to translating individual, group, environmental, systems, or novel technology strategies to behavior change research. Experience working with underserved populations is desired. Teaching and mentoring on theoretical, methodological, and substantive issues in the social and behavioral sciences in the widening context of current nutrition challenges is expected.

Candidates are expected to have demonstrated outstanding scholarship through publications in premier journals, a good track record of external funding, a commitment to teaching excellence and student mentorship, including work with a range of diverse students, and involvement in national and international efforts toward societal impact.

The Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy distinguishes itself by its breadth of scholarship in nutrition research, education, and public impact: from cell to society, food security to healthy aging, individuals to policy, and health to sustainability. We bring together biomedical, interventional, social, behavioral, public health, economics, and food systems scientists to conduct work that improves the nutritional health and well-being of populations throughout the world.
