Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion


DEI remained a top-level priority, embedded throughout SBM. This year we:

GIVING CAMPAIGN

Proven Science—Better Health Giving Campaign

\$115,700 total contributions made to support the next generation of behavioral medicine researchers, be heard by policy makers, communicate members' science to the public, and support postdoctoral member research.

- 170 registrants and \$20,000 raised to advance SBM's science communication efforts during the 3rd Annual Stride for Science Run/Walk in Philadelphia
- 2 postdocs each awarded an \$8,000 Bridging the Gap Research Award
- 2 SBM Past Presidents remembered and honored through the C. Barr Taylor Eating Disorders & Obesity Student Research Excellence Award and the Norman B. Anderson Keynote Address
- 24 young professionals received discounted training for the Monica Baskin Diversity Institute for Emerging Leaders
- 20 sustaining monthly donors
- 10% membership giving rate
- Distinguished Student Excellence in Research Awards increased from \$500 to \$1,000, helping to ease the financial burden of travel expenses for young professionals in need

- Philadelphia, PA
- 1,849 attendees
- 120 sessions in 32 topic areas

Mentoring

- 77 students had Annual Meeting posters critiqued by SBM Fellows
